Dear Friends of The ICA at VCU,

With its colorful art, beautifully preserved architecture, and energetic music and dance, Cuba will inspire you with its creative vitality—the extraordinary legacy of African, Indigenous, Spanish, and French influences over four centuries. This October, join me and the Museum Travel Alliance in Havana where we'll have a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to witness aspects of contemporary Cuba that few visitors see.

As an art historian, museum curator, and ArtCurious host, I am passionate about making art more accessible to everyone. That's why this journey is so exceptional: We'll experience Cuba's art culture intimately, with intriguing local artists welcoming us into their homes to see their work firsthand. On a curator-led tour of the Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de La Habana, we'll encounter the vibrancy of contemporary Cuban art, from the Warholian canvases of Pop artist Raúl Martínez to the multimedia works of Ana Mendieta, the exiled Cuban-American visionary whose controversial life and death I've covered on ArtCurious.

At elegant private receptions, lively meals, and behind-the-scenes tours of privately owned companies, conversations with friendly Cubans from all walks of life—including an award-winning choreographer and a former ambassador—will give us a fascinating window into the state of the nation. Expert guides will take us behind the scenes of cultural treasures, including a look at four centuries of Old Havana's splendor, from Baroque exuberance to Art Nouveau sparkle, during a walking tour with an architectural historian.

Beyond Havana, we'll venture into Cuba's countryside, marveling at the otherworldly limestone hills known as *mogotes* and joining a local farmer for a guided look at the art of tobacco cultivation. Our adventure will even transport us to Ernest Hemingway's Cuba, including his cherished home and the village that inspired *The Old Man and the Sea*.

Jennifer Dasal is an art historian and the creator and host of the acclaimed <u>ArtCurious</u> podcast (2016–23), which introduced listeners worldwide to "the unexpected, the slightly odd, and the strangely wonderful in art history." In September 2020, Dasal's first

book, ArtCurious: Stories of the Unexpected, Slightly Odd, and Strangely Wonderful in Art History, was released by Penguin Books. Dasal is the former curator of modern and contemporary art at the North Carolina Museum of Art (NCMA), where she worked for 13 years. She earned a B.A. from the University of California, Davis, and an M.A. from the University of Notre Dame, both in art history. She also completed Ph.D. coursework in art history at Pennsylvania State University.

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SATURDAY, OCTOBER 19: DEPARTURE / HAVANA, CUBA

Welcome to Havana! Upon your independent arrival in Havana, you will be greeted at the José Martí International Airport and transferred to La Reserva Vedado, the boutique hotel and our home for six nights. This evening, gather for our welcome dinner at a *paladar*, a privately owned restaurant in the proprietor's home, largely staffed by family members.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 20: HAVANA

Founded in 1519, Havana remains the Caribbean's most impressive historical urban center. At a morning lecture, a local architectural historian will prepare you for a walking tour of Old Havana (Havana Vieja), offering insights into the history of the city's remarkably well-preserved buildings.

Then embark on an expert-led walking tour of Old Havana, a UNESCO World Heritage Site comprised of 900 historic buildings that perfectly showcase the city's Caribbean, Spanish, French, and British heritage. Your exploration will focus on four of Old Havana's expansive plazas: Plaza de Armas, Plaza Vieja, Plaza de San Francisco, and Plaza de la Catedral. Each plaza features a window into the Old World, including centuries-old cathedrals and colorful colonial houses adorned with arcades and balconies.

Following lunch at a *paladar*, take a private tour inside the splendidly renovated, Neo-Baroque Gran Teatro de La Habana Alicia Alonso, the incredibly ornate home of the Cuban National Ballet. Then explore the homes and studios of some of Havana's leading artists, where there may be an opportunity to purchase paintings and drawings. Dinner is at El Cocinero, followed by an evening of entertainment next door at Fábrica de Arte Cubano (FAC), the city's liveliest multidisciplinary performing and visual arts space.



MONDAY, OCTOBER 21: HAVANA / VIÑALES / HAVANA

As a marked change of pace from Havana, set forth on a morning ride aboard a motor coach through the countryside, arriving in the western province of Pinar del Río, known for its lush tobacco haciendas. Admire the unique topography and natural beauty of the Viñales Valley. The most striking sights are the region's UNESCO-recognized mogotes, distinctive hills towering as high as 1,000 feet, with steep, almost vertical sides. Meet with farmers for a private tour of their tobacco hacienda to learn about the drying and rolling processes, followed by lunch at a privately owned organic farm. Before returning to Havana, visit the studio of a local painter who has charted the history of his community through his work. Tonight, enjoy dinner on your own.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 22: HAVANA

Take an inside look at the Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de La Habana (National Museum of Fine Arts of Havana), Cuba's largest museum, with a private morning tour of its Cuban art collection at the Palacio de Bellas Artes. In the company of an independent curator, trace Cuba's history, from the 17th century to the present, through the works of its greatest artists. Highlights include the modern paintings of Raúl Martínez, known as Cuba's answer to Andy Warhol, as well as the avant-garde canvases of 20th-century painter Amelia Peláez, and works by the revered Afro-Cuban surrealist Wilfredo Lam, who was influenced by Picasso.



After lunch, walk down Calle Obispo, Havana's main shopping street; explore a local design shop; and speak to the owners about small business practices in Cuba. In the early evening, drive to The Ludwig Foundation of Cuba, one of only a few Cuban NGOs, for a presentation on Cuban art. The Foundation's President will host a cocktail reception and buffet dinner on the penthouse terrace, where guests will include local Cuban artists. This evening, you may opt to attend a performance at one of Havana's famed music venues, including the legendary Tropicana.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 23: HAVANA / SAN FRANCISCO DE PAULA / COJÍMAR / HAVANA

Head outside of the capital to the small, hilltop village of San Francisco de Paula. Here, take an inside look at Finca Vigía (Lookout Farm), Ernest Hemingway's residence for two decades. Initially rented for Hemingway's partner Martha Gellhorn in 1939, Finca Vigía soon became the writer's property after their relationship ended. Hemingway lived at the seaside villa with his last wife Mary, who lovingly tended to the home. His classic works, For Whom the Bell Tolls and The Old Man and the Sea, were written here in its breezy rooms and shady porticos. With its pastel walls, dark wood furnishings, and high ceilings, Finca Vigía exudes an airy timelessness. View the rooms through open windows from the surrounding terraces; see Hemingway's famous fishing boat Pilar; and climb the tower to his study.

Our excursion concludes with a brief visit to the village of Cojímar, the setting for *The Old Man and the Sea*. After lunch, return to Havana and gather for a lecture on the island's current realities by a former ambassador who was once Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs. In the early evening, attend a private afterhours tour and reception at the Museo Nacional de la Cerámica Contemporánea Cubana, housed in the 18th-century Casa Aguilera, followed by dinner at a local *paladar*. THURSDAY, OCTOBER 24: HAVANA

Delight in exclusive access to an informal morning rehearsal of the Rosario Cárdenas Dance Company, featuring some of Cuba's most gifted contemporary dancers. Afterwards, visit the Colón Cemetery with a local guide. With its ornate tombstones commemorating Cuban heroes, statesmen, and novelists, this cemetery is sometimes called the largest sculpture park in Cuba. Following lunch on your own, visit a private classic car workshop, NostalgiCar, where some of the city's finest vintage cars are repaired and refurbished.

Next, explore the renowned Hotel Nacional de Cuba.

Designed by the acclaimed New York firm of McKim, Mead & White, this 1930 architectural masterpiece features a medley of styles, including Sevillian, Roman, Moorish, and Art Deco.

Stop in its storied Hall of Fame to see tributes to its many famous guests, including Buster Keaton, Rita Hayworth, Nat King Cole, Sir Winston Churchill, Jean-Paul Sartre, Simone de Beauvoir, and Gabriel García Marquez. Enjoy a mojito on a terrace overlooking Havana's harbor before dinner. This evening, celebrate with a festive farewell dinner at one of Havana's excellent paladares.
